

Grow Your Own Examples

The following are examples of financial resources and programs that can support participants involved in Grow Your Own (GYO) programs.

Forever Buckeyes

A provision of law that removes the 12-month period of establishing domicile in Ohio before becoming eligible for in-state tuition rates. Extends the in-state resident tuition rate to any public or private Ohio high school graduate who leaves the state but returns to enroll in an undergraduate or graduate program at an Ohio college and establishes residency in Ohio.

Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program

Provides funds to students who are completing or plan to complete the coursework required for a career in teaching and agree to teach full time for at least four years at an elementary school, secondary school, or educational service agency that serves students from low-income families

Troops to Teachers

Provides stipends and bonuses to assist separating or retiring military personnel in pursuing a career in public education (elementary, secondary, or vocational). The Ohio Department of Education also waives the fees for educator licenses for veterans and current service members.
